It was certainly a special reading session. The highlight was the public reading for the first time of Sacha Jammu's newest publication, Are You Kidding Me! She is a very entertaining reader who engaged all the students as she read the lovely, fun book that will soon be in schools all across Manitoba.

Jammu is a French-Canadian mother of three who is married to Sohan Jammu, of Indo-Canadian Punjabi heritage. She said she derived her creative inspiration from her multicultural family, as together they embrace the rich blend of cultures that define their lives.

Unable to find a picture book that related to their family's experiences, the couple teamed up with Sacha's mother, author Pauline Lafond (who is also former school superintendent), and together they crafted a heartwarming picture book set in the vibrant world of an Indo-Canadian household that follows the daily adventures of Yuvi, a young boy, and his sister, Jaz. Amidst their escapades, a touch of magic emerges as readers discover Yuvi's ability to communicate with animals.
